As we wrapped up this term for Our Lady of Grace, at our Spring Conference, that was held at St Peter Claver Church, some affiliates awarded their Handmaiden of the Lord awards. The recipients for that

Our ladies were very busy with many projects going on at all 5 affiliates.

The CCW at Christ the King is please to report the have 237 paying member and six circles. The ladies held a Rosary procession and conducted rosary durding the forty hours of adoration in October. At the Advent Social \$1,600 fund were raised for the Bishop's Vocation Fund. The quest speaker was seminarian Tyler Gates.

Circle 14 held the annual Pickles and Pepper Jelly Sales. Proceeds went to local charities.

Circle 22 hosted their annual "Twinkle on the Terrace" Christmas Party in partnership with West Coast Foster Care. The families received gifts form their wish list and enogh gfifts were let over to stock for their future needs.

Circle 16 had a Toy Drive in December that collected over 1800 toys along with \$5,000.00 in gift cards and cash. The recipients were CTK St. Vincent DePaul, St. Peter Claver, the Salesian Youth Center and West Florida Foster Care Services..

Circle 18 held their annual ornamnt sale for the support of their Project Shoes initiative, they sold out of 700 ornaments.

Christ the King hosted a celebration for Fr. Jacob's 80th birthday and 50th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood. The CCW contributed funds to help offset event expenses and helped with volunteers at the event.

Approximately 70 ladies attended their annual Fat Tuesday dinner event. New this year: food was catered by Catering by the Family and we charged \$5 admission, which is helping fund a new scholarship for CCW members' children and grandchildren who are graduating high school.

During Lent they have hosted one Friday Lenten Dinner on Friday, March 7. The menu was tortellini or spaghetti with salad and breadstick. They alternate Fridays during Lent with the Knights of Columbus Fish Fry and CCW Lenten Suppers.

Catholic Women's Club been meeting via Zoom only.

Incarnation CCW goal this year was to focus on our mission statement goals:

- Meet spiritual needs with the help of our Lady
- Encourage fellowship and commitment among the council members
- foster personal religious growth
- minister to the parish through service
- minister to the member's needs by visiting the sick, prayer line etc.

The members staff the shop, keep track of inventory and track the funds. The shop is a major fundraiser for our group as well as providing spiritual gifts and sacramentals to meet the needs of the parish...

The adopted 3 families for Thanksgiving by presenting them with gift cards to Aldi's.

They held an Advent retreat for our members which started with Mass in the church, then moved to our meeting room to enjoy a continental breakfast, and our pastor was the guest speaker and culminated with a pot luck lunch.

ICCW hosted a Senior Luncheon for all parishioners of our parish. Over 50 people attended plus about 15 volunteers which included teens from the parish who helped serve at the Mass and waited tables for the luncheon. The day started with a healing Mass continuing with a luncheon where food was prepared by members of ICCW, there were many raffle drawings and a 50/50 that was divided between 2 winners; no money was kept by the affiliate.

A Lenten retreat was held that started with Mass in the church, a continental breakfast and then a guest speaker, and ended with a pot luck lunch.

They held a Mass for those members of our affiliate who were ill and attended as a unit.

They will support their parish by providing a reception for those in the OCIA program after the Easter Vigil, a reception for the first communicants, and the newly confirmed.

They support the catholic youth of the future with a \$1,000 scholarship for a deserving student from our Incarnation Catholic School.

ICCW also helps other ministries such as the beautification program, luggage for foster children, and eyeglasses for the Lion's club.

ICCW helps support SPDCCW by collecting tabs and pennies for priests.

St Patrick's CCW has been busy. They held their annual Sean Connelly Memorial Blanket Drive.

The biggest event of the year is the Victorian Tea, that will be held in April.

St. Peter Claver CCW is made up of hard working women that impact the parish community in may ways. The ladies hold many leadership positions such as chair of the Finance Council, Stewardship Committee, head of Food Pantry distribution for St, Vincent de Paul and more.
